Position Description:

The UCLA Master of Social Science program (MaSS) is seeking to hire a lecturer for Spring 2024 to teach SOC SC 403 Quantitative Evidence and Analysis in Social Sciences. This course will be offered as an elective for all students enrolled in the MaSS program. The expected enrollment is 10-20 students. SOC SC 403 provides advanced training in data analysis using R software and statistics. Students will gain experience working with datasets, and with designing, testing and validating statistical modeling techniques.

The course is taught in a seminar format and include a mix of lecture, demonstration of software tools, tutorial-guided self-study, collaborative and individual work, and discussion.
